Fort Caspar Museum Site Tours

Learning Opportunities for Third and Fourth Grade Students

Fort Caspar Museum interprets the cultural history of Fort Caspar, the City of Casper and central Wyoming. Site Tours include two activities: a tour of the fort and grounds as well as the Gallery Exploration Activity. Tours of the fort and grounds focus on the Trail and Army eras and include a walking tour of the reconstructed fort buildings, Mormon Ferry, and Guinard Bridge. Students focus on looking and listening during this activity.

The Museum Gallery features exhibits on Pre-historic Peoples, Western Emigrant Trails, Frontier Army, 100 years of the City of Casper history, the Oil and Energy Industries, and Cattle and Sheep Ranching. Following an introduction to the activity and a review of "Museum Manners", grade-appropriate activity sheets guide the students through the exhibits. Students focus on reading and writing during this activity.
